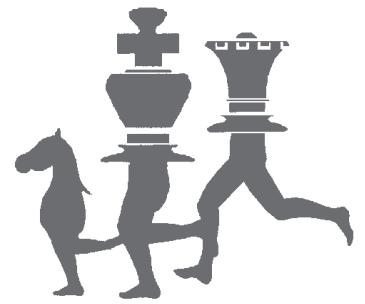

These three scholastic chess teaching programs start the week of January 4, 2010, and continue until the end of March or early April. These are great opportunities for students wanting to do their best at chess, including competing in their school grade at Regional and Alberta Chess Challenges which occur in February, March and April. Top school grade players at Alberta Challenge are sponsored to go to the National Chess Challenge in Montreal in late May.
